The structural funds are a great leverage to finance future projects for the development of our territories. It is very practical to fund major infrastructure serving the economy, social inclusion projects to fight against unemployment and exclusion or research to develop future energy and the digital future.

Nevertheless, the procedures to benefit are complex and sometimes unstable. It is therefore important that Europe finds solutions to offer a clear reading, simplified and therefore more effective rules.
